

# **Old History**

- 3 Traditional Clubs in Lowestoft
- Lowestoft Club 80+ years old
- Lowestoft South 36+ years
- Lowestoft East Point 20 years

South Club started due to "classification"

East Point due to "Twilight"

All Rotary Clubs are Dual gender!!!

Only one Lowestoft Club is currently dual gender



# Recent History

- Membership has been falling across all 3 Clubs
- Average age at Lowestoft club is over 70
- South Club had 3 Presidents last year and this!
- East Point lost 6 members in 12 months (none have died!)



# Lowestoft 3 Club Meetings

- The Clubs have been meeting, effectively, for 5 years
- President, President Elect, President Nominee attend
- Each Club "chairs" meetings annually, in turn.
- Looking at common interests and support
- Successes include Dictionaries 4 Life, Crucial Crew.
- And now "Rotary 2"



# Recruitment

- All 3 Clubs have tried to recruit individually
- But numbers remain stubbornly low
- We have recruited "Friends of Rotary"





# Lowestoft Rotary2 Project Team

- Initially 3 from each Club
- After first meeting, invited District Team to come along
- Decided to take the message to club members
- Decided to hold a 3 Clubs meeting for all members
- Over 60 attended.
- Back to each Club for discussion and agreement



# Consultation is Key

- Each Club, individually agreed to move forward with Rotary2
- No votes against.
- A few abstentions
- Fair to say some votes for were "hesitant"
- Had concerns for impact on the "Mother Clubs"



# Springboard to Success

- Project Team agreed to:
- 2 meetings in Lowestoft one in the north and one in the south
- For "fireside chats"
- One in a cafe Midweek 7.00pm
- One in a pub Saturday at 10.00am
- Both Meetings in May
- Community Model

# **Lessons Learnt!**

- Member begets member 100% in Lowestoft
- All bar one interested person for our first meeting was the product of ONE Rotarian's efforts.
- Rotarians are afraid of the impact on their own Club
- Timing (day of the week and time) of the meeting is difficult with small numbers
- Time of year!
- Dennis Spiller "the new image Club needs to be a product that people aged between 30 and 50 want to be part of" – our experience is most are 40+



# Lessons learnt

- Don`t invite/accept "Old Rotarians"!
- Venue preparation/confirmation
- Don't "overcrowd" with Rotarians
